

Some idea of the popularity of this production is gleaned from the fact that only counter and mail bookings on the first day received seats in the price sections required. From then on it was a struggle to accommodate even in second best situations . . . endeavouring throughout to do our best, and plodding on into the wee sma' hours for several days to cope with the avalanche. Fantastic situation in a theatre of these proportions. Proof positive of your demands.

Alas! At the time of writing there is nothing of the required standard to bring to the "GLOBE" in the month of March. It is not our intention merely to fill in a date in order to maintain the sequence of a show a month during the season. We shall continue to honour your confidence, and, unless a production is worthy, nothing less than the "tops" will suffice in the respective fields of Opera, Ballet, Musical Comedy, or Variety. Please keep a watchful eye on the press

just in case of a late announcement, however.

April 13th week is a highlight—the first visit of the SADLER'S WELLS OPERA COMPANY. An outstanding event, and one of which we know you will take full advantage. Details of repertoire will follow, and should we decide to start booking in advance of March 16th, the amended date will be well advertised. A slight increase in most seat prices—a rare occurrence in this theatre—is unavoidable for the Opera, due to the necessity of removing the first three rows of orchestra stalls seats (100 appoximately) to house an orchestra of fifty-six musicians. Furthermore, only one matinee performance is possible, and that on the Saturday, naturally. You will still see the SADLER'S WELLS OPERA, as with all productions here, at more reasonable prices than anywhere else in the country.
