# The Stocktonian Once Again

The School Year which closed on the 26th July has been one of considerable moment in the life of the School. In the first place it has seen the inauguration of the Examination for the General Certificate of Education intended by authority as a reform of the former School Certificate. The old pass standard of 30 per cent. is now no more; gone too are the ancient glories of honours, distinctions and credits, Instead a pass only is awarded, and only to candidates gaining not less than half marks in a subject. No candidate may be presented before completing a course of five years in the School. We have accordingly been compelled at last to abandon the old system of a four year course which we pursued almost alone among Secondary Schools, to the end that all our pupils might have the chance of trying for a School Certificate. Our success in the first General Certificate Examination at ordinary level (that is to say for five year pupils) is one which we can surely consider worthy of congratulation. Forty pupils were presented and secured among them a total of 201 passes, an average of a shade more than five per candidate. Some estimate of the quality of this result may be formed when it is realised that the new regulations governing matriculation at the various universities demand passes at the ordinary level in three or four appropriate subjects supplemented by two at the advanced stage, these latter being taken of course in the Vith form after a further two years' study.

Public examinations came to an end with the end of June, and were immediately followed by an event in school history which has been variously an occasion for countless hopes and as many disappointments over a period of forty-five years; for it was in the autumn of 1906 that the need for suitable secondary accommodation was first expressed.

Preliminaries to removal had been in hand over many months and the great event might have become a reality in time for Easter had the weather and numerous other factors more or less human, proved kindly. The actual removal began on the 30th June, and was practically completed by the 4th July, for the efforts of the official removers were considerably supported by very loyal assistance from a considerable number of willing boys who might, had they so desired, have employed their days of liberty from normal school attendance in three days of the brightest sunshine enjoyed this summer in this usually murky region. We completed seventeen school days in our new home before the summer vacation. The official opening date has not been fixed but there is some ground for believing that this will be before the conclusion of the Autumn term.

Quite a number of Old Stocktonians have already visited our new home and have we fancy, been suitably impressed with the liberal accommodation and equipment, the spaciousness, and the brightness of it all. Many more we hope to see as the months roll by, and a whole army at least next July when we hope that it will be possible to hold the School Sports and Old Boys' Cricket Match at long last on a ground of our own.

In 1896 the School began its history as the Stockton-on-Tees Higher Grade School; in 1906 it improved its status as a result of the passing of the 1906 Education Act, and became the Secondary School; the Act of 1945 transformed us into the Secondary Grammar School and now

in 1951 we acquire the title of (Stockton-on-Tees) Grangefield Secondary Grammar School—perhaps just a shade too cumbersome it might be supposed, especially by those of us who like to think of the school over the whole of its 55 years of life as really one and the same. Perhaps a century hence the school will still be in possession of its fourth name, and justifiably proud of it if its record in the future is an extension of the not insignificant quality of its record in the past.

Next Autumn the School will admit 120 new pupils as compared with the 60 of Nelson Terrace days, a process which will be repeated annually until it has grown to fill its accommodation of 550, after which the annual intake will be a normal one of 90. This expansion will involve a corresponding increase in numbers on the staff.

#### THE ASSOCIATION

It is earnestly hoped that Mr. G. D. Little, our President for the past two years, who by the way has extended his activities on election to the Durham Diocesan Board to consider re-arrangement of benefices, will be able to continue in office for a third period, this in spite of the fact that as we were proud to record last year, there are so many movements and associations in this locality which require his talents and energy in a variety of official capacities. Perhaps Mrs. Little, a warm friend of the Association, will act for us in this matter and exercise her genius for gentle persuasion should our President seek to turn a deaf ear to our earnest supplications.

It is with a considerable amount of pain that we have to record this year a falling off in the yield of information relating to old boys, their successes and so on. Any items of interest and information should be addressed either to the Secretary or to the Old Stocktonians, Grangefield Grammar School for Boys, Stockton-on-Tees, and their transmission need not call for hours of letter writing or coy reluctance. Old Boys do not realise how heartening it is to receive even the briefest message, especially in these days when there is too evident a tendency to regard ourselves as mere numbers and names. The addition of date when at school is helpful, not to jog the memories of association permanent officials, though they occasionally totter, but as a useful for other Old Boys who are often not quite certain whether the John Dory now promoted Air Marshal or sent to the gallows, was the bright eyed young rogue who years ago sat in a neighbouring desk and sported with a compass point to the discomfort of his neighbours and consequent distraction of a revered instructor.

To all Old Boys we send a kindly greeting of remembrance, with good wishes for the future to the School, the Association, and Stocktonians, past and present—old and young.

#### WAR MEMORIAL

The fact that we are now established in the new school makes it imperative that the question of a war memorial should become a practical issue.

The selection of a suitable position for the 1914-18 Memorial in the new school is presenting difficulties in view of its size and weight, and the poverty of adequate wall space in the new building. The committee are actively engaged in this matter with the appropriate authorities and are considering at the same time the problem presented

of making the new memorial a worthy one to be placed in appropriate position relative the old one. So far we have £41 in hand towards providing a worthy remembrance of the forthy-three names of those Old Stocktonians who gave their lives in the Second World War. We need at least a further £80. A contribution of 5/- from each of our members who have not yet subscribed is all that is necessary. A form to accompany subscriptions is enclosed with this year book.

#### James Allan

Art Master, 1898-1928.

Mr. Allan though not on the staff at the time of the opening of the School was always regarded as one of the original band of masters whose names were always linked with the identity and the traditions of the school in the important early years of its life. Many Old Stocktonians hold precious memories of James Allan's unfailing kindliness, his indomitable patience, his friendly smile; and not a few whose talents lay in pencil or brush, realise with deep gratitude what they owe to his encouragement and inspiration. The designing of the 1914-18 War Memorial was his work. During his twenty-three years of retirement at Saltburn he never forgot us and as recently as last December wrote regretting that advanced years (he was then 81) forbade his making the journey to be present at the Old Boys' Dinner. To Miss Allan we would express our deepest sympathy.

#### Corporal Peter Hugh Bell, R.A.F.

Killed at the age of 25, a victim of the riots last Autumn in Singapore. Peter, as we all knew him, was the son of Mr. Percy H. Bell, also an Old Stocktonian, and in his schooldays, which ended during the war years, resided with his father at Manor Farm, Bishopton. He matriculated at 15 and immediately on leaving school at the age of 16 proceeded to Halton R.A.F. training station, serving later during the war in France, Holland and Germany. The unrestful years in the Far East took him to Java and, later, Singapore. To the latter station he had returned after a 'goodwill tour' in an R.A.F. unit to the U.S.A. and Canada, and at Singapore he met his untimely end. Of Peter we at the old school have many happy memories for he was a good natured lad, with winning ways and a ready smile. With his parents, his widow and his infant daughter we would express our earnest sympathy and regret.

#### Eric Mitchell

Left us in the early years following the first Great War to embark on a career of civil engineering. In this he distinguished himself, becoming while still a very young man. Engineer to the Borough of Merthyr Tydfil, a position he occupied at the time of his lamented passing at a very early age. To those left to mourn him we send expressions of our deepest sympathy.

#### STAFF CHANGES

Since the new school is in every way much larger than the old premises in Nelson Terrace, it is only natural that staff additions had to be made.

First, however, we had to bid a sorrowful farewell to one of the Old Brigade:

In July, 1951, Mr. Gavin Kay ended his long connection with the school, much to the regret of us all. Mr. Kay served us loyally and faithfully for thirty years and his ripe experience and fine musicianship insured that his choir-work bore continuously excellent results. Since both Grammar Schools have been organised on a larger basis a full time music master was necessary and Mr. Kay's many other committments made it impossible for him to undertake so much additional work; even all his energy and activity could not contemplate so heavy a programme. He takes with him, of course, our affectionate good wishes and our warm and appreciative gratitude for all that he has done for us.

In his place comes Mr. B. R. White, B. A, who divides his full-time between both schools. A Northcountryman—he was educated at Ryhope Grammar School—he had had experience in teaching music in three schools including Loughborough College, and he was deputy conductor of the Welwyn Garden City Orchestra. Already he is giving good proof of his enthusiasm, for the school orchestra, which we have for so long wished to revive, is now functioning. He has also started a full school choir and we are hoping to have a real concert with choir and orchestra some time next term.

Mr. N. W. Flinn, B.A., who is assisting in the history department, comes from Manchester. During the war he served abroad in the R.A. as Captain. Besides being a historian, he plays the viola and the clarinet and his help with the school orchestra is of first rate value.

Another ex-captain is Mr. W. A. Miller, B.A., who, after serving in the D.L.I. with the Central Mediterranean Forces, graduated with 1st. Class Honours in French at Reading University. He is not really strange to these parts, since he was educated at Guisborough Grammar School.

Mr. Dumble, who for so long acted as games master, now confesses to feeling, like so many of us, not so young as he used to be; accordingly he asked for the help of a younger man to take up P.T. and the coaching of games. A rugger stalwart whoplayed for the famous Hartlepool Rovers is now with us in the person of Mr. J. E. White. He received his early education in the Henry Smith School, Hartlepool, and was professionally trained at several P.T. Institutions: we confidently expect good results for our matches with other schools and in our games generally.

Yet another new master is Mr. Piper, B.Sc., a mathematician from King's College, Durham. He also is familiar with the northeast, for his old school is Heaton Grammar School, Newcastle. He also has a lengthy war service in Italy, Palestine and elsewhere to his credit in the R.A.F.

Another former airman, a pilot and Flight Lieutenant, is Mr. T. K. Whitfield, B.A., who served in the Middle East, and is now a geography specialist. We may perhaps be allowed to offer Mr. Whitfield a special word of welcome, for he is an Old Boy of the school and many of the members of the staff taught him as a pupil from 1933-1937.

#### ANNUAL DINNER, DECEMBER 14th, 1950.

This year's re-union was of a special character for several reasons. To begin with, our guest of honour was Dr. W. J. Armit, chairman of the I.C.I., Wilton Division. The presence of so distinguished an industrial scientist would of itself make any such function remarkable. Then again, the President and Committee had decided that, as Dr. Kinnes was just beginning his twenty-second year as Headmaster, the occasion should be marked in some way. They remembered also that Mr. J. Wilkinson had held the Old Boy presidency for twelve years and had been largely responsible for the survival of the O.S.A. during the war and for its resuscitation—services which could hardly be allowed to go unrecognised. Finally, no doubt because of these circumstances, the attendance was greater than had been anticipated by our none-to-sanguine Secretary: with the three Presidents a company of no less than 85, including the school prefects and at least one O.S. from as far afield as Trinidad.

After suitable inner fortification we filled our glasses (at the expense, once again, of the ever-generous Alderman J. Spark) and drank. Excuses for the glass, after the loyal toast, were provided by The Old Stocktonians, The School and The Visitors.

In proposing the first of these. Dr. Armit was reminiscent—alas, too discreetly—of the days in France when he and Dr. Kinnes were serving in the same company of the Royal Scots. After Mr. G. Little had suitably responded, the School was proposed by Colin Bowron. Alleging nervousness as a youngster among greybeards, he said his say with a fluency, confidence and charm that roused the envy of most and the admiration of all. Dr. Kinnes's witty reply looked back to the trenches and forward to Grangefield. Then Mr. Baldwin welcomed the Visitors with a nearly-naughty story and Mr. George Hepper (speaking at short notice in place of Mr. G. Chetwynd, M.P., who was detained by Parliamentary business) was as apt and as amusing as he was brief. This would normally have concluded the prose of the proceedings, but on this occasion Councillor Eric Brown was called upon to present the Headmaster with a propelling pencil to mark the anniversary mentioned above, while Mr. Brooke (keeping his secret to the very end of the speech) had a similar surprise for Mr. Wilkinson, Each of the recipients was greeted with vociferous applause for his long innings.

Pleasant as were these proceedings, they had left us but little time to enjoy the musical entertainment arranged for us. However the Rev. A. Smith (accompanied by Mr. S. C. Bragg) sang two Handel songs very delightfully, and Mr. George Hepper amused us with story and ditty until most reluctantly the President brought to an end another highly successful O.S. dinner.

As we go to press we learn that our congratulations are due also to Councillor STANLEY H. CURRY who was installed on Monday, 1st October, as President of the National Federation of Meat Traders, at their annual conference at Margate. Coun.
