

Life in Stockton on Tees

A POTTED HISTORY OF ROBERT NICHOLSON AND HIS STOCKTON FAMILY

Early Life

Robert was born in February 1880 at Brampton Cumbria. He grew up a country boy with a great love of nature and with a particular love of horses. Family stories confirm he was a keen and successful pony and trap competitor in and around the Cumbria district. In sport he was also a successful boxer and athlete.....

but that's a story for another day!

Life in Stockton on Tees

He arrived in Stockton on Tees in his early 20's. Records show at 21 he was working as a machinist in Stockton and living in a house in Bright Street.

On 27 September 1904 age 24 at St Peter's (C of E) Parish Church in Yarm Road Stockton he married Edith Clough a spinster age 23 of 25 Ewbank Street Stockton. Family stories confirm that Edith worked as a seamstress and hand lace maker with her sisters Emily and Annie, at their home in Ewbank Street.

Marriage

Edith and Robert's marriage certificate confirms he was now living at 2 Allison Street Stockton. He was a Licensed Victualler at this address, running a free house at his public house called The Brassfinishers Arms. (Brassfinishers used to be a trade in Stockton) Today, Allison Street has now been replaced by a new Stockton access road. This starts at the roundabout at St Mary's RC Church and ends at Bishopton Road, just before it leads into the The High Street. The Brassfinishers Arms stood at the Bishopton Road end. (A picture postcard is supplied in this file.) It shows Robert's only child, Muriel, age 3, standing on the step with a barmaid in the window.

Children

The 1911 Census confirms that whilst living at the Brassfinishers Arms they had one child living, 3 years old and two years previous, a child who had died. Research at Stockton Registry Office confirmed this was a girl named Edith (obviously named after her mother) who had died two years before Muriel's birth on the 19 May 1907.

Interestingly, although the family were Church of England and had a history of attending St Peters C of E Church in Yarm Road Stockton, Muriel attended the Roman Catholic Convent known as Wellington House on Norton Road at the other end of Allinson Street, all her schooling life. This was near the other end of Allinson Street . It was commonly known that she was taught French at the Convent, a skill she was still able to demonstrate in later life. She always kept her French school text book costing one shilling and six pence covered in brown paper all her life. Her small school wooden chair was also always a treasured keep sake.

Muriel went to work as a shop assistant in the Co-operative Department Store Wellington Street Stockton where she specialised in men's and women's fashion. Her love of fashion was said to have been developed whilst working alongside her mother and aunties working as seamstresses.

In her early twenties she became engaged to Edmund Sainsbury, a member of the family who owned ship's chandellers in the area. He contracted TB or "consumption" as it was called then. He was sent on a cruise to New Zealand where he died. Muriel was heartbroken. However some years later she met her future husband William who lived with his family in Nelson Terrace Stockton and married him at the age of 31.

Living and working in another public house in Stockton

Evidence in trade and electoral roll directories confirm Robert lived in The Brassfinishers Arms from 1904 – 1929. Family history also confirms that the family lived and worked in The Blue Posts public house but no records have been found during this research period. However if anyone does have any information the author would be grateful to learn more.

Signing up for War

It was during this time living in the Brassfinishers Arms that Robert signed up for war. It was on the 6 October 1915 at the age of 35 years and 8 months that he joined the Royal Engineers and enlisted for the army The AD newspaper in this file confirms that recruits had to be between 19 and 30. As his records show with his love of horses he enlisted to work with horses in The 235th Company Troop of The Royal Engineers .

A spell in hospital

It is noticeable that his records show he had a spell in hospital *prior* to his action in the field for which he was awarded the Military Medal. From his own stories of his war service, perhaps this hospital need could have been as a result of riding his horse BOB across a field under heavy fire, to successfully blow up an ammunition dump, only to ride back with his horse and his long booted legs on fire. On return he told the story of how he had to shoot his beloved horse in the head to put it out of its pain. He never mentioned how his own lower legs were disfigured for the rest of his life. Also it is evident from his service records that he did not claim to have any disabilities on leaving the service.

Moving to Norton

Records show that the Nicholson family was living in Eamont Road in 1932. This Norton council estate was all named after rivers. Interestingly the River Eamont is in Cumbria where Robert came from — could that have influenced his choice of new home? It was also said that soldiers from the WW1 were given priority for housing on this development.

Living at Norton

At home in Eamont Road the author remembers Robert always had a large picture on the wall of him mounted on his beloved horse BOB. Also a beautiful framed certificate in ornate writing starting with. "For gallantry in the field......" hanging above his fireplace.

Back home, Robert carried on his love of nature. He was always out in the street talking and feeding the community service horses, particular the fruit cart horse. He would breed white mice in his garden shed for children in the area to understand and enjoy. Training his blue budgie Joie to say almost anything and taking it outside in the garden where it just never left his shoulder was quiet amazing to experience. He would feed and talk to wild birds who he would befriend when flying down to him. He was a

constant radio listener or wireless as it was called then. When television arrived in the 50's he always said he would never buy one because they were time wasters. Until, he saw the nature programs produced by Armand and Michaila Dennis on Safari which changed his mind! He was amazed at what he saw on the small screen as he called it then. He also wrote and typed poetry on parchment paper about the Second World War

Obituaries

Robert outlived his wife Edith and daughter Muriel. Edith died of a stroke in the 50's in her 70's at home. His daughter Muriel died age 49 following the Asian flu epidemic which resulted in kidney failure and blood poising in the private Middlesbrough hospital, Carter Bequest.

The Electoral Roll shows Robert as living in 9 Eamont Road Norton until his death.

Robert Nicholson died in June 1961 at the age of 81 in Sedgefield Hospital from brochopneaumonia and congestive cardiac failure.

Grandchildren

Robert was survived by his two granddaughters Lesley Marian and Glenys Muriel. The later still lives in Stockton on Tees today.


