RULES.

The following rules were approved at a general meeting held on Mar. 14th, 1913.

- I.—The name of the Association shall be the "Old Stocktonians." The "Old Stocktonians" aims at continuing friendships and preserving that spirit of comradeship which ought to exist among those who have been educated at the same school. These aims are to be achieved by means of social, recreative and educative pursuits.
- 2.—The Association shall be open to the Old boys of the Stockton Secondary School and of the late Higher Grade School. Past and present masters are also eligible.
- 3.—The government of the Association shall be vested in two Presidents, not less than three Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, two Secretaries, and a Committee of sixteen, which shall include one representative from each Section to be elected by that Section.
 - (a) Of the Presidents, one shall be the Headmaster: the other shall be elected annually.
 - (b) All the other officials shall be elected annually.
 - (c) A member holding any office shall be eligible for re-election in the following year in the same or any capacity.
 - (d) In Committee seven shall form a quorum.
 - (e) The Committee shall have power to co-opt any member or members at their discretion for the time being for any particular purpose.
- 4.—The Committee shall have power to refuse membership to any applicant for admission or to ask any member to resign (after investigation by the Committee and confirmation by a general meeting), whose conduct they consider such as to militate against the welfare of the Association.
- 5.—Each Section shall be self-governing and self-supporting. The Committee, however, shall have power to grant financial aid to any Section.
- Each Section shall submit its programme to the General Committee for approval.
- 7.—The annual subscription shall be one shilling, payable to any member of the Committee before January 1st.
- 8.—These rules shall be altered only at the annual general meeting, and then only by a two-thirds majority: all motions of such alterations to be in the hands of the Secretaries fourteen days before the date of such meeting.
- The annual general meeting shall be held in the latter part of September.

The Association was formed at a largely attended meeting of Old Boys, held in the School, on Jan. 24th, 1913, the Headmaster presiding.

The first Annual Social was held in the Borough Hall on February 21st, 1913, upwards of 250 being present.

The Picnic to Swainby, on Whit-Monday, was somewhat deficient in numbers but was thoroughly enjoyed by all those present.

The Colours and Badge adopted by the Association proved very popular, ninety-six hat-bands being sold.

An arrangement was made with the Magazine Committee of the Secondary School, by which five pages in the summer number of the Magazine were devoted to Old Boys. In return, the Old Stocktonians guaranteed the sale of sixty magazines, which number was easily disposed of.
