

#### Stockton "Guns Week"



Big subscriptions promised at inaugural ceremony. Again the appeal is made to the people of Stockton to lend their money to their country in a secure and profitable investment .It is thank the Guns week. The campaign commenced today but under circumstances which were not too propitious-work was not quite as brisk in the factories as it has been since the war.

The influenza and pneumonia epidemic is rampant in the town, to make matters still more depressing after so many days of dry frost and sunshine the weather took a disagreeable change. Still in the words of the soldier's song, Stockton is "not downhearted" and may be relied upon to do its bit this week no matter what the condition and if promises count for anything the success of the Thank the Guns week is



assured. The campaign commenced with a monster procession, the imposing character of which must live long in the minds of the thousands-young and old that saw it pass along the route from Bishopton Lane, Norton rd., Dovecot Street to the gun site in the High street. There the people saw the guns that have wor, a big victory and other agencies that have assisted on the great cause of right since 1914.

The procession was marshalled by Supt-James, included police, military bands, naval and military detachments. volunteers, guides, scouts, nurses, discharged men, munition workers, the town clerk and Deputy Mayor Sir Frank Brown. Captain B Watson said he had no hesitation in asking people to invest their savings in War bonds and War savings certificates because there was no better security in the world. Colonel Spence, the vicar of Stockton and Major Appleby also addressed the meeting and the proceedings terminated with hearty cheers for the king up to noon the following investments were promised-South Durham Steel and iron Co-£50,000 North eastern railway Co £25,000 Yorkshire penny Bank-£20,000

#### AN IMPUDENT ROBBERY

Stockton young woman in court at Coventry.

Florence Jackson (26) of 4 Queen Anne Terrace Hartburn, Stockton was summoned at Coventry on Monday with stealing on March 28<sup>th</sup>, a basket and a suitcase containing lady's clothing, value £12 the property of the London and North Western Railway Co. Miss Jones a local munition worker. left the property in the waiting room, the next morning the case couldn't be found. Elsie Jackson. defendant's sister living

defendant's sister living in Birmingham spoke to seeing certain articles at the house where they both were lodging. Defendant went home on Aug 2<sup>nd</sup>, and gave witness some of the things. Detective Potter of the Railway service in Birmingham spoke to

Hartburn first she said she knew nothing of the matter, and then told the truth, she did steal the basket and case from Foleshill. She added that from the Station she took them to the hostel where she was staying as a munition worker. Afterwards she sent some of the things to Stockton. Defendant in court pleaded guilty. Her father was present, and said that the girl had a good home and there was no need for her to steal. A railway official said the family was most respectable. The bench said it was a cruel injury to a fellow worker the defendant had committed. They bound her over to be of good behaviour for 12 months and ordered payment of £5 to prosecutrix.

#### **NO SUNDAY TRAMS**


Demand of munition workers

On the question of the suspension of the local tramways services on Sundays the town clerk (T Downey), in answer to **Councillor Mc Naughton** at Tuesday night's meeting of Stockton town council, said he had been in communication with the tramway company. He had received a reply that the Board of Trade required a reduction of 15 per cent in the tramways coal consumption, and that amongst the suggestions as to how this was to be achieved was the stopping of the Sunday service. Councillor Warters said that was a great injustice to the working men who had to travel on Sundays. He noticed that the manager of the company had suggested to Middlesbrough that these men could travel by train, but was it an easy matter for working men living at Norton and Tilery to travel to Thornaby for a train to

Middlesbrough on Sundays? Moreover since when had the Tramway company ceased to be competitors of the Railway company and anxious to put traffic in their way?

Alderman Natrass said when they read of the Great War news they had in the past few days it was their duty to help to keep it up and not do anything which would give the munition worker an excuse for not going to work to turn out the goods, (Here, Hear) **Councillor Bowman** suggested that if the corporation could not get satisfaction form the tramway company they should appeal to the board of trade.

After further discussion it was unanimously agreed to take this course.
